## ITEMS <u>NOT</u> TO BRING INTO THE BUREAU OF PRISONS

- 1. Large number of photographs
- 2. Magazines or books
- 3. Private art collection
- 4. Cellular phone
- 5. Any pornographic materials
- 6. Suitcase with alternate wardrobe
- 7. Credit or debit cards
- 8. Personal hygiene products
- 9. Handbags or wallets
- 10. Illegal drugs or any controlled substances not prescribed to you

## ITEMS YOU ARE ALLOWED TO BRING

- 1. Plain wedding band (no stones or intricate markings)
- Earrings for females only (no stones) with a declared value of less than \$100
- 3. Medical or orthopedic devices (as necessary)
- 4. Legal documents
- 5. Social security card or other forms of identification (driver's license, passport, etc.). These items will be retained in the Inmate Central File until the inmate is released from custody.
- 6. Religious items approved by the warden as long as they do not present a threat to the security of the institution (religious medallions and chains must have a declared value of less than \$100; this applies to males and females)
- 7. Prescription glasses
- 8. Cash or other negotiable instruments (travelers checks, money orders)
